



## Nova's Karmic Astrology

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### 1. The Core Pattern: A Karmic Grand Cross (Vesta–Mars–Saturn–Jupiter/Pallas)

At the heart of this chart is a **cardinal grand cross**, which already tells us a lot from a past-life perspective:

- Vesta in Aries, 11th house
- Mars in Capricorn, on the 7th/8th house cusp
- Saturn + Lilith in Cancer, 2nd house (21°)
- Jupiter + Pallas in Libra, 5th house

This is a **soul that incarnates under pressure to act**, but also under pressure *not* to act freely.

**Past-life theme:**

This configuration often shows a **life lived in service, duty, or ideology**, where:

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## 2. Saturn–Mars–Chiron: Trauma Around Authority, Punishment, or Exile

- **Saturn opposing Mars**
- **Saturn opposing Chiron (0° Aquarius, 9th house)**

This is a classic signature of:

- punishment for action
- wounds around belief systems, truth, or knowledge
- exile, imprisonment, or ideological persecution (9th house + Aquarius)
